Election Integrity Is Under Assault

The integrity of our elections is under systematic assault by leftist activists and politicians whose objective is clearly to manipulate the elections for their own gain. Judicial Watch investigators have evidence that special interests, government entities, and even the current administration are:

- Refusing to force states to clean their voter rolls of deceased and moved voters;
- Fighting state efforts to require voters to show a photo ID at the polls;
- Failing to enforce our federal laws against illegal immigration and effectively ending the deportation of illegal aliens, thereby swelling the population of potential illegal voters.

And as Judicial Watch uncovers more and more evidence of the breadth and scale of this effort, it is becoming clear that the objective of what we are seeing is to get leftist (socialist) candidates elected. That's why Judicial Watch is taking action by suing states to force them to clean their voter rolls. We invite you to join our effort now by taking action to support our Election Integrity Project.

Never before has a Department of Justice (DOJ) been so hostile to election integrity laws.

Case in point: The Obama administration's multi-pronged strategy to increase the number of illegal voters in 2012 in order to ensure the president's re-election – a strategy that included:

1. Using Section 7 of the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) to register greater numbers of voters on public assistance, a key Obama campaign demographic. (I call it Obama's "Food Stamp Army.")
2. Ignoring Section 8 of the NVRA, which is designed as a counter-balance to Section 7 to ensure that states maintain clean voter registration lists.
3. Blocking states from implementing reasonable election integrity provisions, such as voter ID laws, even going so far as to file lawsuits against state election officials.
4. Failing to enforce federal laws against illegal immigration and effectively ending the deportation of illegal aliens, thereby swelling the population of potential illegal voters – of which a study at Old Dominion University showed that 6.4% voted in 2008.
5. Deploying thousands of lawyers to challenge voting results that did not favor the Obama campaign on Election Day.
6. Fighting to suppress the military vote, In Ohio, for example, the Obama DOJ filed a lawsuit to reverse the state's long-standing early voting policy for members of the Armed Forces.

Clearly, the election process is vulnerable to incompetence, errors, oversights, and blatant corruption. But there are things YOU can do ... if you are willing to volunteer your time and services to ensure free and fair elections, a process that encompasses events before, during, and after Election Day.

Judicial Watch's Election Integrity Project includes 8 things you can do now to help stop voter fraud.

1. Become a Poll Worker. Poll workers are usually volunteers who are trained by election officials and typically work at a local precinct throughout Election Day. As a poll worker your primary focus will be on specific duties, including greeting voters and helping them sign in, checking voter registrations, providing instructions on use of voter machines, and closing the precinct once polls are closed. You will have the opportunity to ensure the election process under your control is honest and fair.

2. Become a Poll Watcher – or "poll observer", "challenger" or "checker" depending on the state you are from. This position will enable you to make a significant contribution in ensuring accuracy and fairness in elections. You must follow prescribed rules and must register in advance with the county clerk, but generally at least one poll watcher is permitted per candidate per precinct, you can stand or sit in the same table as the election officials, and can be present before polls open to observe set-up procedures, during voting hours to watch the voting process, and after the polls close to observe

the counting. If a poll watcher wishes to challenge apparent questionable activity on the part of a voter or poll worker, he states his objection to the election officials at the poll and the voter can be given a provisional ballot that will not be counted until the validity of the challenge is determined. 3. Perform Voter Registration Research. The key to ensuring voter integrity is being able to verify that the names and

addresses on the voter registration list are legitimate and up-to-date. Voter registration lists can be obtained ahead of the election, and although it can be very expensive and time consuming to check these lists against other available data, it is usually very easy to get a copy of the list for your own precinct from the state or county headquarters of your party. You can also contact True The Vote, and then check voter entries against other resources, like tax information, dates of birth, and deaths from www.tributes.com. Duplicate registrations are easily found.

4. Speak Out at Election Board Meetings and Local Precinct Sessions. Meetings of election boards are an excellent opportunity to find out what's going on and what issues are and are not being addressed. You can ask questions and voice your opinions. Discussions about dead people voting, electronic voting fraud, and ballot tampering should come up. If they don't, you can raise them.

5. Write "Letters to the Editor" and Opinion Editorials. They allow you to comment on and respond to articles in local and national papers. Many legislators keep an eye on letters in the paper to find out what the public is thinking. An op-ed is generally longer than a letter to the editor, provides more in-depth analysis and commentary on a particular policy alternative, and should be very carefully researched so your facts are correct.

6. Call into Radio Talk Shows. You can reach thousands of people at a time by calling into these shows, even local or regional shows. Make sure you write down what you want to say before you call in, so you can voice clearly the points you want to make when it's your turn. Have a one line answer prepared, and make sure you are calling into a show in which the subject being discussed is relevant or at least conducive to what you want to talk about.
7. Create Your Own Blog, or Blog on Other Sites. A blog is a type of website or part of the website in which a person regularly posts content, commentary, or links on interesting items. You can start your own blog and share your opinions with the world. Define your goals, select a topic, and find a subject that makes your blog unique. Election fraud is a sensitive issue and you should have no difficulty getting people to respond. Stay well informed; stay on top of relevant events and what the media are saying in your state and region. There are many books on how to get a blog going, how to make it effective, and how to publicize your blog.
8. Be Active in Social Networking. Millions of people have found social networking sites like Facebook and Twitter are an effective way to communicate and organize. If you haven't already joined, go to www.facebook.com, enter your name, email address and birthday and create a password. Twitter is a little simpler than Facebook, in which you post short messages that are limited to 140 characters. With these messages you can share interesting news stories, inform "friends" what you are doing, or just say what's on your mind. Go to www.twitter.com and click "Get started." Fill out the requested fields and click "Create account."

Can you make a difference? Definitely. In every county in every state where more people are listed on voter rolls than are counted in the Census, there is a problem that can lead to fraud. Recently in Montgomery County, Maryland volunteers meticulously combed through the voter registration rolls and reported to the state election officials 5400 irregularities in 7000 records examined. Clearly the voter registration rolls in many states are a mess, and volunteers like you, working through organizations like True the Vote, local groups or individually can make a huge difference in cleaning them up. Only by volunteers like you examining voter registration rolls and poll working and watching can we ensure free and fair elections.

THE HIDDEN AGENDA IN OREGON

The stand off in Burns, Oregon just ended. A couple of weeks ago, one of the protestors, rancher Lavoy Finicum, was shot nine times by federal agents as he attempted to travel to a public meeting to discuss their purpose. While America is tracking the events in Oregon involving the occupation of a federal facility and the unfortunate death of one of the protestors, major developments are being overlooked:

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (FWS) want the Hammond Ranch, according to the Spring edition of RANGE magazine, an award-winning publication that advocates commonsense solutions to problems facing people who live and work on the land. RANGE is a recipient of three consecutive Freedom of the Press awards.

Writing in "Up Front," editor C.J. Hadley reveals: "The agencies have blocked the family's stock waters and access roads to their high country grazing land, canceled their legal grazing permits, and seem determined to destroy ranch and family so that they can add that private land to the 187,000-acre Malheur National Wildlife Refuge. Besides being locked up [in federal prison] in California, the Hammonds had to pay \$400,000 by Dec. 31, 2015, for destroying federal land and were forced to give first option on their ranch to the BLM—the agency working to destroy them."
